a city in northern Poland, located on the Brda River and Vistula River. Bydgoszcz is the eighth-largest city in Poland. It hosts the Pomeranian Philharmonic concert hall, opera house, Bydgoszcz Airport and numerous universities.

Bydgoszcz is an architecturally rich city, with gothic, neo-gothic, neo-baroque, neo-classicist, modernist and Art Nouveau styles present, for which it earned a nickname Little Berlin.

> The granaries on Mill Island and along the riverside belong to one of the most recognised timber-framed landmarks in Poland.

The city's riverside location provides visitors with the opportunity to view some of Bydgoszcz's greatest sights by boat. Water tours are a wonderful way to enjoy the scenery both during the day and at night. There is also a sculpture here suspended on a rope over the river called "Man Crossing the River" that is probably unlike any other sculpture you have seen before.



One of the most interesting features of the city is the Mill Island on the Brda River, also known as the "Bydgoszcz Venice". The houses sit so close to the edge of the water that they almost appear to be resting on it. This is a great place to have a cup of some tea or coffee while soaking up the atmosphere. Bydgoszcz has several noteworthy landmarks.

At the top of the list is the Bydgoszcz Cathedral, with its 15th-century red brick exteriors and colourful interiors. The Minor Basilica of St. Vincent de Paul is another exciting stopping point. This large church can hold up to 12,000 people, and its interiors were modelled after the Pantheon.

Green areas are part of the city image. Bydgoszcz is often called a green or a garden city.

It owes this title not only to the parks, old avenues of trees within the city, but also to Poland's largest city park called the Myślęcinek. Its 800 hectares of forest include the Polish Fauna Garden, one of a few in Poland, a Botanical Garden, an Alpinarium, an equestrian centre and tennis courts, just to name a few.

Kazimierz Wielki University conducts recruitment for the doctoral school in the following academic fields and disciplines:



The PhD candidate is supervised by a supervisor who should be contacted before recruitment. Every year in June, UKW publishes a list of supervisors who are ready to accept a doctoral candidate. Recruitment can be carried out online.

The candidate's diploma should be legalised. Details are available in the NAWA Qualifier system (available in English): https://kwalifikator.nawa.gov.pl/.

Doctoral candidates receive scholarships and can also stay in a student dormitory (low price compared to market prices for renting apartments). Doctoral candidates are provided with standard health insurance.

Registration website

First step is to create the account. Then you have to return to the registration website and follow all the steps.

Language requirement

English level B1/B2 – language certificate is required.

Required documents

It is the student's responsibility to upload all the required documents by the deadline to his/her account on the registration website:

- Application form (has to be downloaded, signed and uploaded together with other required documents),
- · Transcript of Records of the recent studies,
- Language Certificate proving at least B1/B2 level of English,
- ONLINE Learning Agreement if possible,
- Copy of the passport (non-EU citizens) or national ID (EU citizens).

Student is also obliged to send OLA (Online Learning Agreement) by the deadline.

Academic calender

Winter semester starts on 1 October and ends in the middle of February. Summer semester starts in the second half of February and ends on 30 June.



PRACTICALITIES

ARRIVAL

The easiest and most convenient way to get to Bydgoszcz is to arrive at Bydgoszcz airport or the airports located in such cities as Warsaw, Gdańsk, Poznań or Kraków which have train/bus connections with Bydgoszcz.





EU/EEA students: No need to apply for a visa or a residence permit. Non-EU/EEA students: Applying for a visa from their home countries is obligatory.

INSURANCE

All the students are required to bring insurance from their home country: health insurance, accident insurance, liability insurance. In addition, students from EU/EEA countries must bring a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC = in polish: EKUZ), obtainable in their home countries.

WORK

While EU/EEA students are eligible to work in Poland, non-EU/EEA students need to apply for a work permit.

ACCOMMODATION

Erasmus+ students have the opportunity to be accommodated in our student house if they manage to submit their applications by the deadline.



Number of single rooms is limited -'first come, first served' rule is applied.
