

<b>Title:</b>	<b>Polish substantive administrative law</b>

<b>Course content:</b>	<p>The aim of the course is to enable students to learn and understand the basic concepts of Polish detailed, substantive administrative law. The course covers selected issues of substantive administrative law that affect the largest groups of residents. Particular emphasis will be placed on the following topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Legal foundations of spatial management in Poland.</li> <li>2. Legal conditions for construction in Poland.</li> <li>3. Public real estate management.</li> <li>4. Legal conditions for agricultural activity in Poland.</li> <li>5. Legal requirements for animal husbandry in Poland.</li> <li>6. Legal conditions for conducting business in the field of food production and trade.</li> <li>7. Citizens' documents. Identity cards, passports, civil status records.</li> <li>8. Legal conditions for civic activity. Associations, foundations, activities of the third sector, and political parties.</li> <li>9. Cultural activity. The operation of museums, theaters, operas, and philharmonics.</li> <li>10. Security organization in Poland. The army, police, municipal guards, fire departments, and border guards.</li> <li>11. The education system in Poland.</li> <li>12. Organization of science and higher education. Polish Academy of Sciences, research institutes.</li> </ol>
<b>Learning outcomes:</b>	<p>The course will provide examiners with knowledge of the theoretical and detailed aspects of selected, specific areas of substantive administrative law in Poland, which most significantly impact the daily lives of citizens. Classes, conducted through case studies and case law and literature analysis, will allow students to expand their knowledge and acquire new analytical skills in the interpretation and application of specific administrative law. Through comparative analysis, students will be able to analyze the public law system of administrative law, identify its strengths and weaknesses, and formulate proposals for changes, implementation, or application of specific legal solutions.</p>
