<b>Learning outcomes:</b>	On completion of this course, learners will: understand the fundamental principles and sources of international aviation law; identify key international organizations and legal instruments governing civil aviation; analyse liability regimes applicable to air carriers and passenger rights; evaluate contemporary legal challenges in aviation (e.g., environmental protection, UAV regulation); develop the ability to interpret international aviation agreements and case law
